

PRE-ASSEMBLY:


- Remove all parts and hardware from the box and lay out on a clean, carpeted, or scratch-free work surface, as this will avoid damaging any parts during assembly. The shipping box provides an ideal work surface. Do not dispose of any contents until assembly is completed to avoid accidentally discarding small parts or hardware.
- Use the parts and hardware lists above to identify and separate each of the pieces included.
- The illustrations provided allow for easier assembly when used in conjunction with the assembly instructions.
- Note: Do not fully tighten all bolts until all parts are in place. Failure to follow these instructions may cause the bolts to misalign during assembly.
- If using power tools to aid in assembly please use caution. Power tools can damage hardware or split wood.

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS:


- Connect the Left/Right Side Panel (C & D) to the Shelf (G) by aligning the wooden dowels on the Shelf (G) to the pre-drilled holes on the Left/Right Side Panel (C & D). Make sure the slots on both panels are facing inwards. (Fig. 1)
- 2. Align and secure the (3) Divider (E) to the Shelf (G) using (6) Long Wood Screw (O). (Fig. 2)




- 3. Place the Top Panel (A) on the assembled piece. Insert (4) Bolt (K), Spring Washer (L) and Flat Washer (M) from the pre-drilled holes on the Left/Right Side Panels (C & D) to the pre-drilled holes on the Top Panel (A). (Fig. 3)
- 4. Slide the Back Panel (F) into the slots on the Left/Right Side Panel (C & D). (Fig. 4)



5. Put the assembled piece upside down on the work surface. Insert (4) Plastic Cap (N) into the pre-drilled holes on the Shelf (G) and Bottom Panel (B). Place the Bottom Panel (B) on the assembled piece. Lift the Bottom Panel (B) a little bit to allow the Left/Right Door Panels (H&I) into the Plastic Caps (N) on the Shelf (G) and Bottom Panel (B). Check alignment and secure the Bottom Panel (B) with the remaining (4) Allen Bolt (K), Spring Washer (L) & Flat Washer (M). (Fig. 5)



- 6. Upright the assembled cubby. Check alignment and tighten all bolts and screws.
- 7. When connecting to other stacking Cameron cubby piece, place a T-Shape Bracket (R) over the predrilled holes on back of the cubby pieces securing with (6) Short Wood Screw (P). Repeat with the other T-Shape Bracket (R) on the other side. (Fig. 6)
- 8. When connecting to side Cameron cubby piece, place a Square Bracket (Q) over the pre-drilled holes on the cubby pieces. (Fig. 7)



CARE INSTRUCTIONS:

- Dust with a clean, soft cloth.
- Blot spills immediately, and wipe with a clean, damp, cloth.
- We do not recommend the use of chemical cleansers, abrasives, or furniture polish on our lacquered finish.

WARNING: This product is only a deterrent. It is not a substitute for proper adult supervision.

Young children may be injured by tipping furniture and the use of a tipping restraint is highly recommended. When properly installed, this restraint could provide protection against the unexpected tipping of furniture. We recommend mounting this restraint to a wall stud.

All Parts and Hardware are included with the Cameron Wall Cubby.

PARTS INCLUDED (S) Plastic Restraint - 1pc (U) Long Screws 3x32mm - 2pcs (V) Short Screws 3x19mm - 2pcs

Note: For safe mounting it is essential to use the proper hardware for your wall type. The included hardware is for drywall or stud mounting only. For other wall types (ie: plaster, concrete, brick...) please consult your local hardware store.

- 1. Locate a wall stud behind your furniture. Position a bracket on the stud approximately 1" below the top of the furniture. Mark and drill pilot hole into the center of the stud with a 3/32" drill bit. Attach a bracket to the stud with the long screws provided.
- 2. On the back of the furniture, a bracket will need to be attached to the furniture frame at the top. To do this, temporarily move the furniture into its final position and mark the location of the wall bracket on the furniture frame. Move the furniture away from the wall and place a bracket on the mark. Mark and drill holes for screws with 3/32" drill bit. Attach the bracket to the furniture with the short screws provided.
- 3. Move the furniture into this final position, taking care to line up the wall bracket with the furniture bracket. Thread a strap through the bracket as shown in the illustration. Tighten strap until snug. Do not over tighten.
